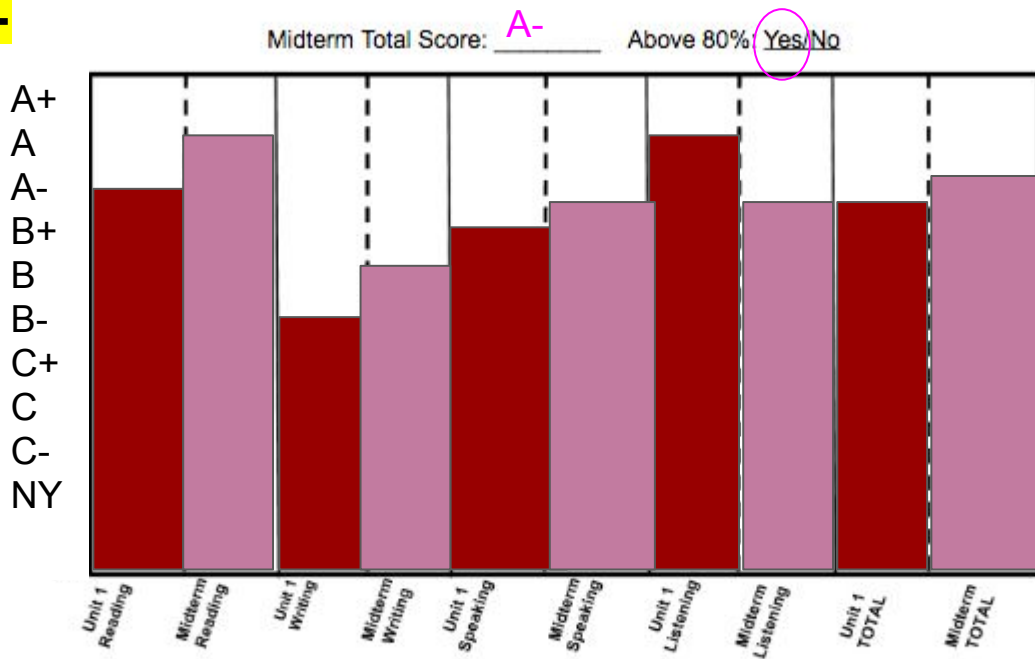

Average temperature now is around 60°



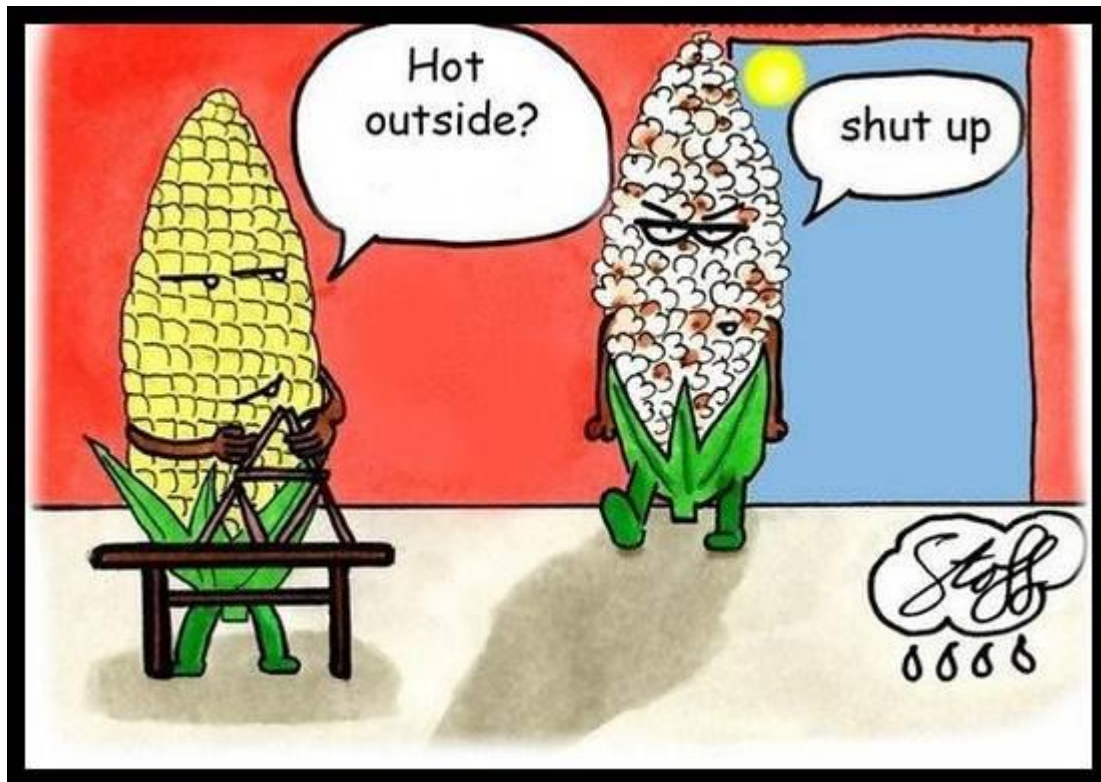

Average temperature now is around 50°



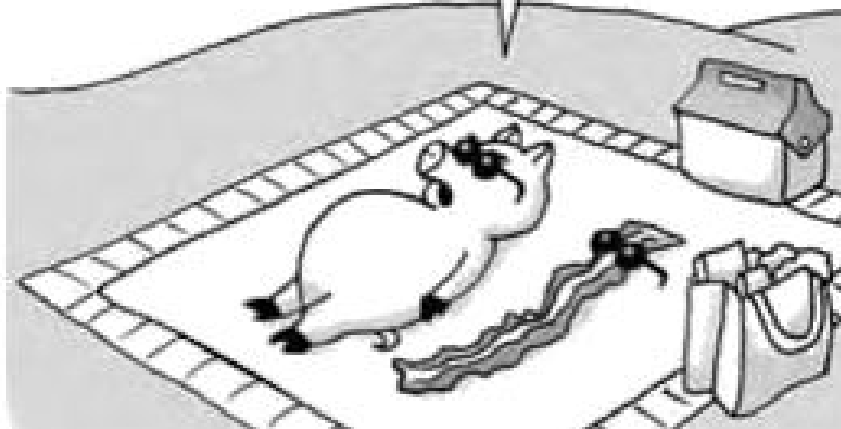

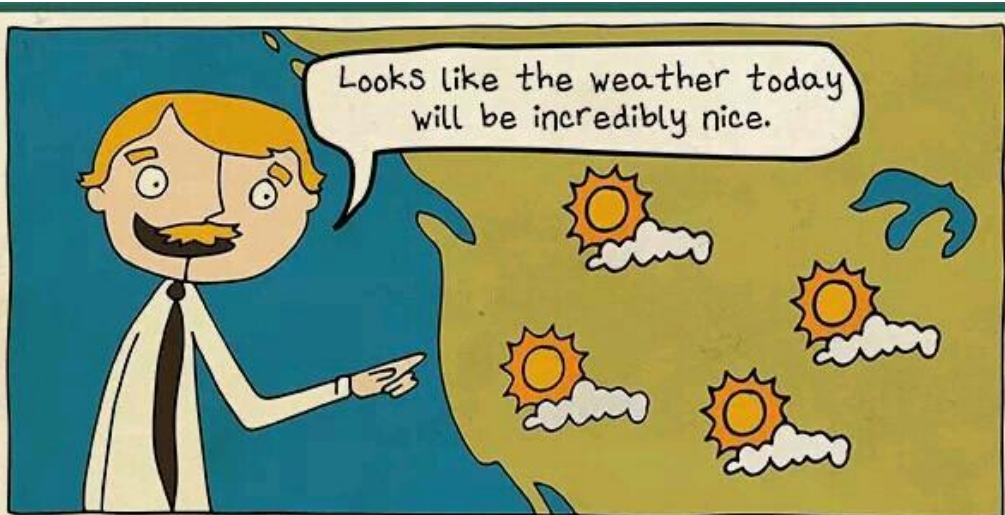

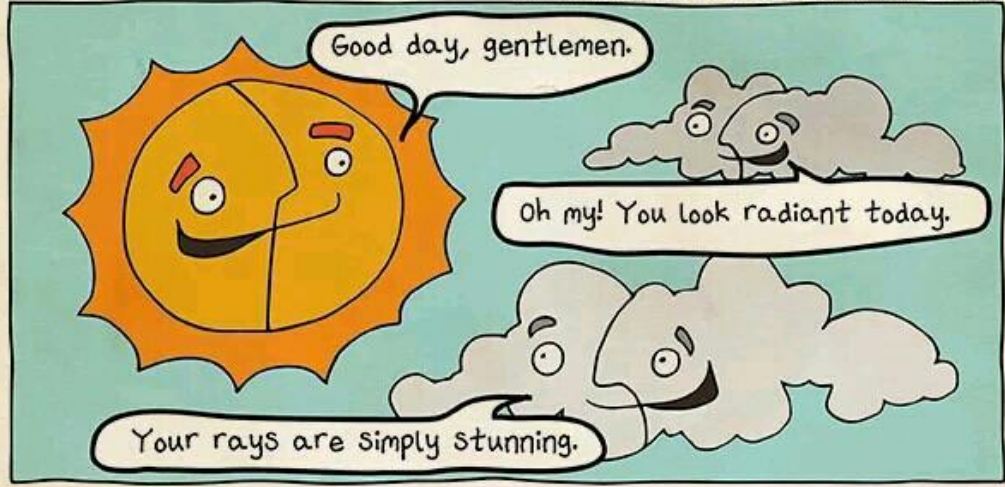
