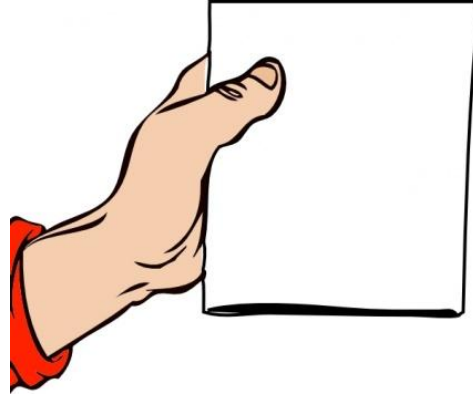

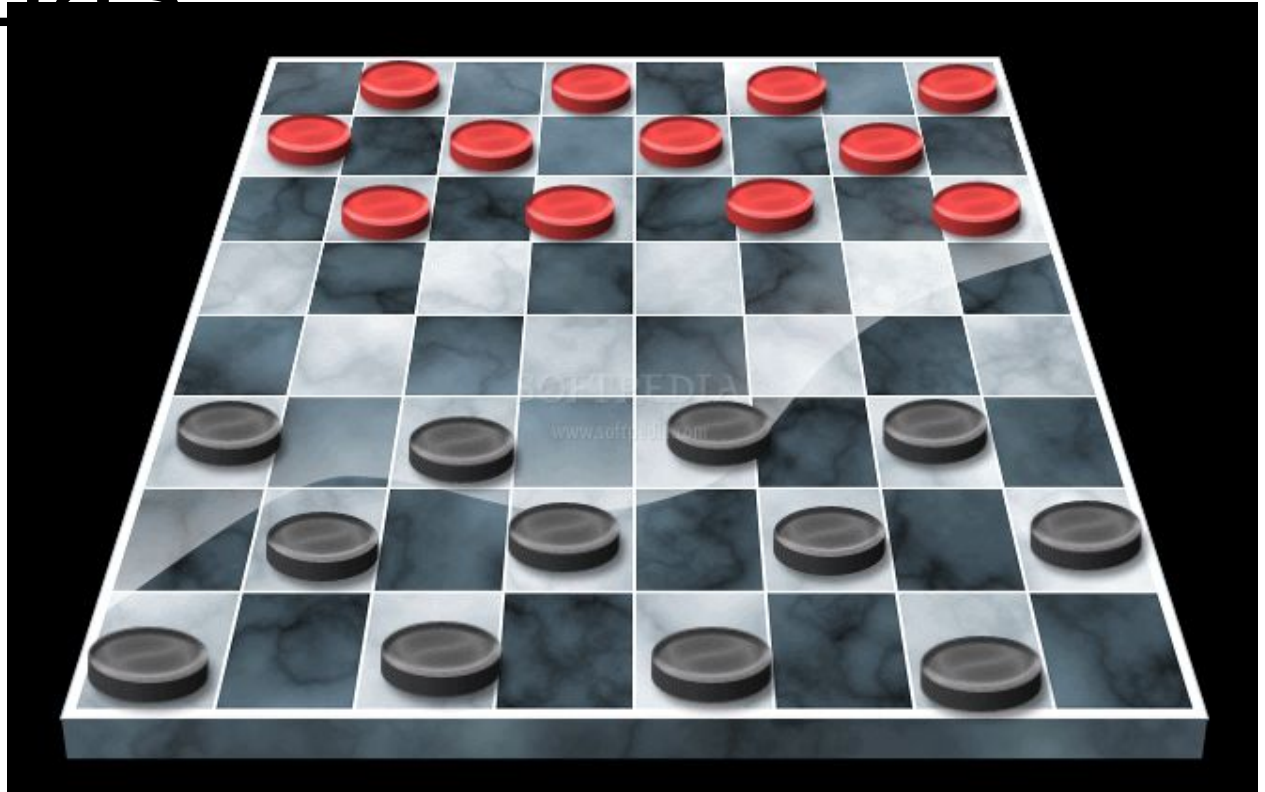

# The script:

## Verbos de bota = *boot verbs*

These kinds of verbs in Spanish are NOT regular. They will not follow the same exact rules on the white poster. Instead, the **STEM** changes. The STEM is the part of the verb we use after we drop off the “ar” “er” or “ir” ending.





Jugar is a “verbo de bota” which means that we change the stem for the “yo” “tú” “él/ella/usted” and “ellos/ellas/ustedes” forms. The stem is “jueg”

“Nosotros” and “vosotros” stem remains as **“jug”**

jugar = to play (a sport/game)



yo juego

nosotros jugamos

tú juegas

vosotros jugáis

él/ella/usted juega

ellos/ellas/ustedes juegan

*How we can use jugar in different ways:*

Yo juego al fútbol americano.

(I play football)

Tú juegas a los dados.

(You play dice)

Nosotros jugamos al basquetbol.

(We all play basketball)

# History of the World Cup

- Began in 1930 by FIFA
- International soccer teams compete against one another
- It happens every 4 years
- There have been 20 different World Cup tournaments
- It is the most widely viewed and followed sporting event in the world
  - even more people watch it than the Olympics!
- Next World Cups to be held in Russia (2018) and Qatar (2022)
  - 10 of the teams competing in Russia will be from Latin America!



# The World Cup in South Africa - 2010

- South Africa was the first country in Africa to host the World Cup
- 32 different international teams participated
- Spain won the World Cup that year against the Netherlands





**“Waka waka (this time for Africa)”** is a song by Colombian singer-songwriter Shakira, featuring the South African band Freshlyground. It was the official 2010 World Cup song, along with the Spanish version “Waka waka (Esto es Africa).”
