¡Hablamos!

When we are talking about what people like, to clarify who we are talking about, we put “A + nombre” IN FRONT OF the “gusta” part to clarify who we are talking about

*Ejemplo: **A mi madre** le gusta la música de country.*

*Ejemplo: **A Profesora Imhoff** le gusta el chocolate.*

*Ejemplo: **A mis hermanos** les gusta la pizza.*

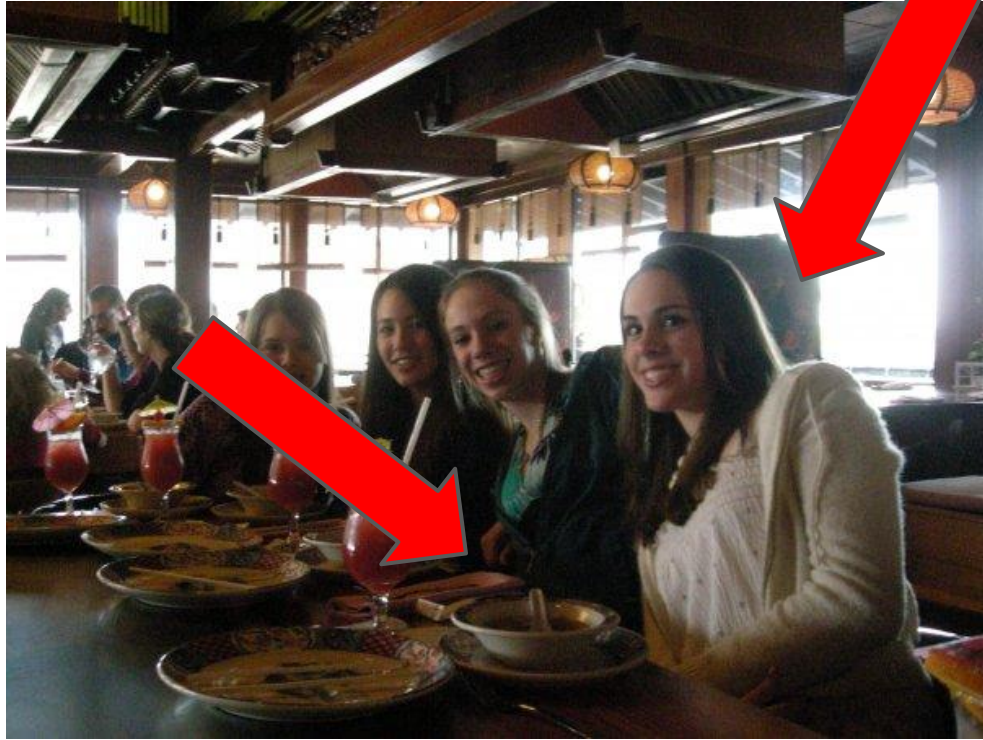

A few words to know for our exam!

y: and

*Ejemplo: Me gustan los gatos **y** los perros*

o: or

*Ejemplo: Es mi hermano **o** mi hermana.*

pero: but - **this does not mean dog (perro)**

*Ejemplo: Me gusta el chocolate, **pero** no me gusta el pollo.*

también: also

*Ejemplo: Me gusta el chocolate. **También**, me gusta el pollo.*
